PARISH NURSING MINISTRY emphasizes the wholeness of body, mind and spirit in congregations and communities. It is based upon the assumption that the church is a place of health and healing. It links faith and health.

A PARISH NURSE is a Registered Nurse who is called to a health and healing ministry in the church or community agency. As a church team member, the Parish Nurse is committed to ongoing theological reflection and education, working with clergy, the congregation and the community.

All nurses registering for Level I as parish nurse candidates are required to submit a letter of application, a letter of reference from your clergy and a current nursing Certificate of Competence.

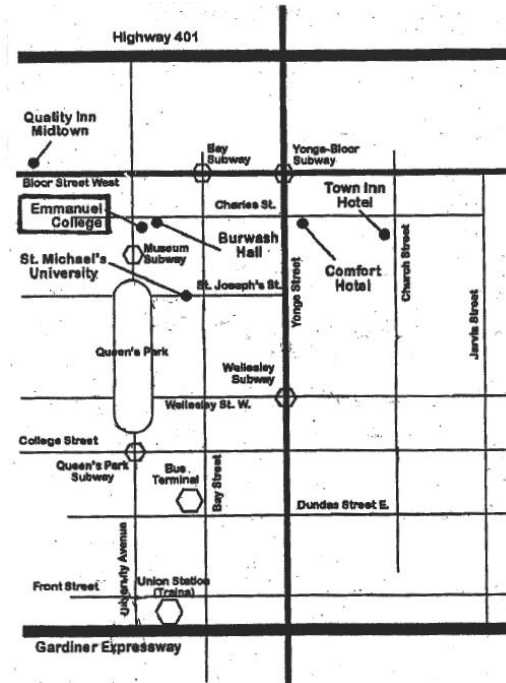
The Parish Nurse functions as:

- integrator of faith and health
- personal health counsellor
- health educator
- advocate and referral resource
- multiplier of "ministers"

There are three levels of education and supervised practice for Parish Nurses serving in ICHM Canada partnership congregations, agencies and special ministries. Health Committee members and Clergy are encouraged to attend the classroom sessions.

REGISTRATION:

- ❖ A registration form is enclosed. Registration for each participant is required
- ❖ **Partner Clergy, Health Committee & other congregational partners:** \$50.00 for any number of congregational members for Level 1.
- ❖ **Partner Parish Nurse Candidates:** a non-refundable fee of \$350 to be paid upon registration.
- ❖ **Independent Registered Nurses (in Level I only):** a non-refundable registration fee of \$350.00 and \$650 partnership fee.
- ❖ Classroom content in Levels I & II is followed by practicum experience for Parish Nurses in a congregational or agency setting.
- ❖ Closing date for registration is **September 30, 2014.**
- ❖ *Program availability subject to sufficient registration. Fees subject to change without notice. Module dates subject to change.*
